TELFORD GEORGES MEMORIAL LECTURE

The first Telford Georges Memorial Lecture was held on Friday 31 March 2006 at the Law Lecture Theatre of the Faculty of Law of the Cave Hill (Barbados) Campus of the University of the West Indies. The lecture, entitled "Judicial Supervision of Executive Action in the Caribbean", was delivered by the Right Honourable Mr. Justice Michael de la Bastide, TC, President of the Caribbean Court of Justice.

The late Right Honourable Mr. Justice Telford Georges, born in Dominica and having lived in several Caribbean territories, was a Privy Councillor, Chief Justice of Tanzania, Chief Justice of Zimbabwe and Chief Justice of The Bahamas. He was also Professor of Law of the University of the West Indies from 1974 to 1981.

Chaired by Professor Simeon McIntosh, Dean of the Faculty of Law, the Memorial Lecture was attended by many Caribbean dignitaries, including His Excellency Sir Clifford Husbands, Governor-General of Barbados; Sir David Simmons, Chief Justice of Barbados and Lady Marie Simmons; the Honourable Dale D. Marshall, Attorney General of Barbados; Mme Justice Wade Miller, representing the Judiciary of Bermuda; Mr. Justice Rawlins, representing Chief Justice Brian Alleyne of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court, as well as Justices of Appeal and Judges of the High Court of Barbados.
